Route S2 Knowle to Fen End & Temple Balsall

Distance: 9 miles (55-70 minutes) or 10 miles (60-75 minutes).

Start: Knowle Parish Church in the centre of the village B 93 0LN SP183767.

Parking: Village car park behind the church (entrance at other end of High Street next to the Greswolde).

Route Summary: A ride along some very quiet and narrow lanes, crossing the River Blythe and its tributaries at a number of fords. *Note: there are footbridges but the roads nearby are liable to be wet after rain.*

Refreshments: Pubs and a cafe in Knowle, plus two pubs en-route and summer Sunday teas at Temple Balsall.

From outside Knowle Parish Church, turn L into Kenilworth Rd soon crossing the Grand Union Canal.

■ Take the next turn L into Elvers Green Lane towards Barston. Go through the ford (or use the footbridge) and after 400 yards follow the road L at the junction towards Barston.

• At the end of **Hob Lane** turn R towards **Balsall Common**. Follow the road through **Barston** past the **Bulls Head** (15th century) and **St Swithin's Church**. Cross over the **River Blythe**.


At the crossroads turn R into **Barston Lane**. Follow the lane until you reach the **B4101**.

Turn R towards **Knowle** then immediately L into **Magpie Lane** passing the attractive half-timbered Magpie Farm.

At the end of the lane turn R into Longbrook Lane. (Turn L at this point to visit Ye Old Saracens Head pub). Cross the ford (beware of mud and stones).

To continue with the 9 mile route via Temple Balsall

At the crossroads turn R and then at the end of the lane turn R again.



M After 1 mile you will come to the historic complex of buildings at **Temple Balsall**. Please dismount and go along the path on the left before the school. Pass **St Mary's church** and the **Old Hall** (teas are served on summer Sunday afternoons). Walk through the cemetery, (one of the first two graves is of Henry Williams who was one of the writers of "It's a Long Way to Tipperary").

N On reaching the lane turn L and after 0.5 miles turn right into **Cuttle Pool Lane**. Continue with the main route at point **K**.

To continue the 10 mile route via Fen End

• At the crossroads go straight on and at the end of the lane turn L passing a number of attractive old houses.

To cycle this route, memorise the instructions between each reference point, relating the turns to the map. The place and road names in **bold** appear on signs along the route.

Doing the shorter ride?

Follow the red reference points for a slightly shorter ride that visits historic **Temple Balsall**.

At the next crossroads turn R into **Oldwych Lane East**. Pass the entrance to the vehicle test track which uses the former Honiley airfield.

Where the road bends to the L take the R turn into **Old Green Lane**. Cross the ford, continuing along the lane and ignoring the turning to the L.

At the end of the lane turn R into **Chadwick Lane**. At the next junction turn L into **Cuttle Pool Lane**. The narrow road descends through a "tunnel" formed by the trees.

At the end of **Cuttle Pool Lane** turn L onto the **B4101** towards **Knowle**. Follow the road back across the **Grand Union Canal**, retracing the route back to **Knowle Parish Church**.

Route M2 Knowle to Lowsonford & Packwood

Distance: 16 miles (95-120 mins). **Start:** Knowle Parish Church in the centre of the village B 93 0LN SP183767.

Route Summary: A route mainly on very quiet country lanes. There is a very short optional section along a canal towpath which avoids a difficult right turn on the A4141.

Refreshments: In addition to the facilities in Knowle, there are several pubs along the route.

Parking: Village car park behind the church (entrance at other end of High Street next to the Greswolde).

The Route

From outside the church, turn L down **Kenilworth Rd** soon crossing the Grand Union Canal at Knowle Locks.

 Turn second R into Cuttle Pool Lane and follow this lane up the hill to the end. Turn R towards
Chadwick End and bear R again at the next junction.
Follow this winding narrow lane for a mile. At the end turn R, towards Chadwick End.

At the A4141 Warwick Road go SO into Netherwood Lane. At the end turn L and at the end of this lane turn L again, opposite the entrance to Baddesley Clinton (National Trust). Turn next R towards Hay Wood. Follow this quiet narrow lane for over a mile, passing Hay Wood picnic area.

■ Turn next R towards **Rowington**. Look out for the **old windmill** (now a house) on the L. At the **B4439** go straight-on towards **Lowsonford**, passing the **Tom O' The Wood** pub. In the next mile you will pass over two canals, a railway and a motorway!

At the end of the lane turn R in the village of Lowsonford towards **Lapworth** (go L for 200 yards for the village pub). Follow this road for 2 miles.

At the **B4439** turn L and then first R towards **Packwood House (National Trust).** Bearing L at the next junction, follow signs to **Packwood House** (and

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continue along this road for 1.5 miles until you pass under a railway.

G Turn immediately R into Bakers Lane and follow this road, eventually crossing the Grand Union Canal and reaching the A4141.

■ Turn L along the main road for 100 yards and first L into **Black Boy** pub. Behind the pub go onto the towpath of the **Grand Union Canal** and turn R. Leave the canal at the next bridge (by the **Heron's Nest** pub – caution there are a few steps here) and turn R onto the main road for 200 yards (a footway is available if you prefer to walk this section).

An alternative route avoiding the Black Boy pub and canal towpath is to continue along the main road and turn right into to Watery Lane at . The main road, which can be quite busy, also leads directly back to Knowle, passing a garden centre with a café.

Turn first L into **Watery Lane**. At the end of the lane turn L to retrace the outward route back to Knowle.
